EXPLORE THE NORTH COAST OF CORNWALL

North Cornwall is renowned for its **SPECTACULAR RUGGED COASTLINE, PICTURESQUE HARBOURS** and some of the **FINEST BEACHES IN THE COUNTRY!**

DIRECTIONS

TIME APPROXIMATELY 1 HOUR 10 MINUTES (NO STOPS)

- From the Services, take the A30 south to Highgate Hill junction
- Take the third exit on to the A39 and follow for approx. 2.5 miles
- At the roundabout take the first exit onto the A3059 towards Newquay
- Take the first right after Westways Filling Station and follow the wooded road past Newquay Airport
- At the end of the road turn left on to the B3276 and follow into Watergate Bay
- Turn right up Trevarrian Hill and stay on B3276 to Padstow
- The B3276 turns into the A389
- Follow A389, which then becomes the B3274, to Winnard's Perch
- For the services take the third exit on to the A39 and then the A30 north

PLACES OF INTEREST

1. Newquay Airport

Look out for all sorts of aircraft from commercial jets to helicopters. It has one of the UK's longest runways and is one of a few suitable for the RAF's Vulcan bomber!

2. Watergate Bay

Famous for its wide selection of restaurants and cafes. It boasts two miles of golden sand at low tide and is a popular surfing and kitesurfing spot. It plays host to surf championships and Polo on the Beach.

5. Mawgan Porth

Idyllic spot with a wide sandy beach perfect for families. It is also home to the Cornwall Aviation Heritage Centre with its wonderful collection of classic aircraft, including jet fighters and bombers.

8. Porthcothan

Small village with beautiful sandy cove backed by grassy dunes popular for sunbathing and a favourite with families.

9. St Merryn

This pretty little village has a motto 'Seven Bays for Seven Days' due to its proximity to some of the most spectacular beaches on Cornwall's north coast. It's home to several pubs, restaurants and cafes, including Rick Stein's Cornish Arms.

12. Padstow

Well known fishing town which is extremely lively almost all year round – Padstow is a fine diners delight with several famous restaurants and pubs as well as numerous shops. In high season, park in Link Road car park and walk down into the town.

13. Rock

Boasts a beautiful beach which stretches along the side of the Camel Estuary all the way around to Daymer Bay at low tide. It has great places to eat, shops and delis and is popular for watersports such as waterskiing and sailing. Can be accessed via foot ferry from Padstow.

PUB/RESTAURANTS

3. Jamie Oliver's Fifteen

Serves up traditional Italian dishes with a Cornish twist, and has panoramic views of Watergate Bay.

6. Scarlet Hotel

Looks out over Mawgan Porth beach to the sea beyond and is the ideal setting to watch the waves and sunset. Serves incredible food!

11. Rick Stein's Cornish Arms

Traditional pub with simple British pub menu.

LANDMARKS

10. Trevose Head Heritage Coast

2.5 miles of beautiful coastline and an ideal place for a short walk. Home to Trevose Head Lighthouse, built in 1847 and open to the public at certain times. Also nearby is the RNLI Padstow lifeboat station.

SCENIC VIEW

4 & 7. Coast road with views out to the Atlantic.
